Sixth Form and Senior School Uniform & Dress Code

CORRECT SCHOOL UNIFORM MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES - NO SUBSTITUTES ARE ALLOWED

School uniform is considered very important at Wingate School. Students are expected to respect the following uniform and dress code and take pride in their appearance. All items of school uniform must be named.

Sixth Form Uniform:

In exceptionally cold or wet weather a topcoat may be worn to and from school but this must be removed during lessons.

All items of school uniform, except footwear and Sixth Form Black/Navy Blue Trousers, Shorts or Skirts, can only be purchased from the on-line School Uniform Shop.

To and From School

Students must wear correct school uniform to and from school.

Hair

Hair should be clean and tidy and, if long, worn tied back off the face.

Hair styles should be conservative and not considered unconventional and should be the natural colour. Sculpted hair styles are strictly forbidden.

Students whose hair is considered inappropriate for school will be given a reasonable amount of time to correct it, normally up to 1 week. However, if a Senior teacher or the Head deem a students' hair is totally unsuitable for school, parents will be asked to collect their child and have the situation remedied before the student can return to school.

Jewellery

We strongly recommend that students avoid wearing any expensive jewellery which falls within the following rules. Wingate School takes no responsibility for loss or damage to any personal jewellery.

Jewellery may not be worn to school because of the danger of physical injury or loss.

The only exceptions to this rule are a watch (except in external exams) and very small plain stud earrings, which must be removed for PE lessons.

Rings, bracelets and wrist bands are not allowed. Charity wrist bands are only allowed for the short duration of that charity event or 1 week maximum.

Necklaces are only allowed for religious beliefs, but these must be hidden and removed for PE or sports.

Make-up

A small amount of natural make-up is allowed. No coloured nail varnish or long false nails are allowed - only short French polish is acceptable.

If you are unsure on the amount of make-up that is acceptable please speak to Mrs Tolfrey or Mrs Hopewell.

Exceptions

If there is a serious medical reason for a child not coming to school correctly dressed, allowances will be made. Students with foot problems such as in-growing nails or blisters will be allowed to wear slippers or an open flat sandal on the injured foot if they have a medical note from their parents or doctor.
